

Sean P. McHugh entered the United States Air Force and attended basic training and Technical training at Lackland AFB in San Antonio, TX in November of 1993 and separated in November of 2001. During his time in the Air Force, Sean served as a Security Policeman in various locations to include Izmir AS Turkey, and Dover AFB, DE. During his time as a Security



Policeman he performed duties as an Entry Controller and Patrolman. In July 1996 Sean cross trained into Readiness (CBRNE) and attended Technical training attended at the Army's CBRN (Chemical Biological Radiological and Nuclear) School at Fort McClellan in Anniston, AL. During his time as a Readiness Journeyman he was tasked with preparing wartime and contingency response plans and with researching and developing disaster preparedness plans. He was responsible for the inspection, maintenance, repair and issue of Chemical, Biological and Radiological response, decontamination and individual protective equipment, and to conduct Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear, and Explosive, shelter management, exercise evaluation and disaster preparedness training to Wing personnel. After his separation from the Air Force in Nov 2001, Sean took a position at the Pentagon as an operator technician of

the Joint Biological Point Detection system protecting the Pentagon reservation. In May of 2002 Sean joined the Department of State Bureau of Diplomatic Security Weapons of Mass Destruction Division as a Senior Instructor. Responsible for training Diplomatic Security federal agents, Local Guard Force members and various Host Nation personnel to including Law Enforcement, Emergency Medical Personnel, Fire Department, Military, and Hazardous Material response teams on Weapons of Mass Destruction Countermeasures. In January 2005 Sean became a Lead Instructor for MARCORSSCOM Marine Air Ground Task Force Consequence Management Course (MAGTAF CM). He was responsible for providing training and certification to CBRN Marines in Hazardous Material Response (29 CFR 1920.120) in Awareness, Operations and Technician T-t-T. In December 2009 Sean became a Senior Analyst on the USAF SG and A7 All Hazard Response training program with L-3 Communications Training medical and Emergency Management personnel at Air Force Installations CONUS and OCONUS. In 2012 Sean became Senior Instructor with FLIR systems for the ANG Civil Support Teams (CST) Domestic Response Capability (DRC) Program and provide SME support to government client on training and logistics of DR-SKO systems. Trained all 57 CST teams across the nation in order to better meet the mission of CBRNE defense training. Worked closely with scientists from the Special Programs Division in Dugway Proving Ground on clan lab setup and downrange evaluation. In May 2019 Sean joined Global 21 to join the team providing training on the CBIRF contract where he participates in numerous training events including, CBRNE Response Equipment, Hazmat, Confined Space and Collapsed structure training. Sean is a subject Matter Expert (SME) for the Homeland Security Exercise Evaluation Program (HSEEP), the National Incident Management System (NIMS), Incident Command System (ICS), Air Force Incident Management System (AFIMS), CBRN/HazMat Response Operations, Decontamination Operations, Incident Command, Security Operations, and Radiation Safety. He is a certified Hazmat Awareness, Operations, and Technician T-t-T with IFSAC and Pro Board.
